T. C. Carr. of the 16th Reg^t of Michigan Vol Infantry
in the service of the United States, who was discharged
at Harrington Va. on the 14 day of November
1862, and is an applicant for an invalid pension, by reason of
alleged disability resulting from a wound received in Action

In my opinion the said Edward Barlow
is totally incapacitated for obtaining his subsistence by
manual labor from the cause above stated.

Judging from his present condition, and from the evidence
before me, it is my belief that the said disability was caused
in the service aforesaid in the line of duty.

the wound as indicated by the cicatrix was in the cardiac
region between the fifth & sixth ribs. the fifth rib being shattered by
the ball. it must have passed behind the Heart as it now appears
to be lodged in the right Sub-scapularis muscle. upon
any attempt at exertion or from a slight cold he expectorates
more or less blood
