for pension executed November 15, 1862, and a state
ment relative to his family, dated June 4, 1898.

The first paper on file in said case which indicates a post-office address in the State of Michimean is a report of an examining surgeon, dated March 23, 1863, at Lapser, Michigan. Under dates of September 16, 1873 and November 2, 1875, the soldier was examined by medical boards located at Grand Rapids, Mich., but the soldier's post-office address does not appear therein. He was again examined September 5, 1883, and said certificate shows that he was then at Muskegon, Mich... Respectfully.
